For this activity you will need:

Hats of different sizes.

Learning to dress is a skill that children need to master. It takes time and practice. Dressing activities help children learn about caring for their clothes and helps in other areas of development.

It may seem strange, but children usually learn how to dress by undressing first. Once you have spotted that your baby has to started to pull off their hat, you can turn it into a game.

Step 1

Each time your baby pulls off their hat, say "Where's your hat?" Watch as your child pulls it off and giggles.

Step 2

Try different types of hat such as a large sun hat or cap so that you and your baby can play peek-a-boo with it.
